



# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF MGM INSTITUTE OF HEALTH SCIENCES

MGM Institute of Health Sciences (MGMIHS), a Deemed University, was founded in August 2006. Within a short span of ten years, the University has come to know as an innovation-driven premier Health Sciences University in the country. Our commitment to excellence is evidenced by Accreditation of the University by NAAC with Grade 'A'; accreditation of teaching hospitals by NABH; accreditation of diagnostic laboratories and blood banks by NABL and RGAY NABH accreditation in Grade 'A' plus. These standards are also testimony of highest standards of patient safety and quality of care provided by teaching hospitals of MGMIHS.

MGMIHS has recently been adjudged the Best Deemed University by DNA,BBC Knowledge, and Star Group of Industries. These accolades are reflection of the accomplishments of the University, 'Team Effort' and 'Quality Culture' at all levels and across all the functions, of which I am proud of.

The accomplishments of the University are a reflection of the vision, commitment, hard work and dedication of the faculty, staff and students of the constituent Medical Colleges and the University Departments. At MGMIHS, the focus has been to make medical education student-centric, and MGM hospitals patient-centric. Students-centricity has been achieved by making teaching-learning processes student-friendly, competency-based, interactive, participatory and by building bonds between students and teachers, by helping slow-learners to overcome their difficulties and by ensuring that essential practical clinical skills are imparted to every student. The patient centricity focus is by offering best available, evidence-based, comprehensive and affordable care with utmost compassion and empathy.

I am delighted to mention that even the Year 2015-16 has been a momentous year for all of us at MGM University. The constituent medical colleges, teaching hospitals, University Departments of Physiotherapy, Nursing and Biomedical Sciences have shown phenomenal improvement in their respective field. These institutions have continued to endeavor that the students graduating have sound core knowledge, creative thinking, competency and attitudes to serve patients, society and the profession.

During the academic year, MGMIHS had achieved the following accomplishments:

• The two MGM Medical Colleges, at Navi Mumbai and Aurangabad, were approved to enrol 150 MBBS students in each college, which is a recognition of the highest standard of education, supported by infrastructure and competent human resource, offered by the University.

- MCh CVTS and DM Cardiology courses have been recognized by Medical Council of India (MCI). The postgraduate degree courses, in broad specialties, offered at MGMIHS have also been recognized.
- MCI approved staring of new postgraduate courses in Geriatrics, Immunohaematology and Blood Transfusion, and Emergency Medicine. Students admitted in postgraduate medical courses have more than doubled in ten years.
- Established UNESCO Chair in Bioethics Haifa with a primary aim to define and promote ethical practices in all academic activities, including teaching, evaluation, monitoring, research and clinical care.
- Clinical Learning and Simulation Skills Laboratories established to offer enhanced simulation, standardized patient care and learning skills, at both medical colleges.
- MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy signed an MOU with University of Sydney, Australia to pursue research and capacity building in Physiotherapy.
- MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy; Department of Mechanical and Materials Engineering, Queen's University, Canada; and S.N.D.T. Women's University, Mumbai, India engaged in interdisciplinary project on pelvimetry to gain an insight in birthing positions which can be used, an initiative sponsored by Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council, and Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute.
- MGMIHS, University of Utah, USA and NanoSynth Materials and Sensors Inc. signed an MOU to develop point-of-care test for diagnosis of pulmonary tuberculosis. Council.
- Publications in peer reviewed indexed scientific journals increased from 122 during 2013, to 244 during 2014, and to 314 during 2015.
- Five patents on research innovation filed during 2015-16 and all have been published.
- The number of Ph.D. research scholars registered with MGMIHS increased from 61 in 2012 to 152 during 2016. Twenty one Ph.D. scholars have been awarded degrees, including nine at the Sixth Convocation of the University held on 30th August 2016 at Aurangabad.
- The hospitals at Aurangabad and Kamothe are doing yeoman service to humanity. The hospitals are equipped with state of the art diagnostic and therapeutic services. Digital radiotherapy, CT scans, MRI, Cath lab add to

the diagnostic accuracies. Both basic and super-specialty services are offered with utmost compassion. Highly qualified, committed and competent doctors deliver patient care at most affordable rates. The population below poverty line and other non-affording patients are treated free of cost without compromising in quality of care. MGM Hospital, Kamothe is located at strategic Bombay Pune Express Highway. The CMOs on duty provide immediate life and limb saving surgery. More casualty management is of frequent occurrence and precious lives are saved through evidence based standardized patient management protocol.

- MGM Hospital at Kamothe also has world class sleep lab established in collaboration with University of Pennsylvania. Research and management of sleep disorders is the mandate of the lab. This is a world class international facility.
- The number of patients availing OPD services at MGM Medical Colleges and Hospitals, crossed one million during 2015-16, including over hundred thousand super speciality OPDs. Over 82,000 patients were admitted during 2015 for delivery of time-sensitive critical care with serious illnesses, injuries and requiring specialised services.
- MGM Hospital, Kamothe empanelled for Rajeev Gandhi Jeevandayee Arogya Yojana to offer cashless comprehensive healthcare services, including major surgeries, to financially constraint population. The hospital awarded Grade 'A1' by NABH Accreditation Assessment for such services. Thousands of patients have availed specialized services in various departments.
- Geriatric medical speciality started to prevent and treat diseases and disabilities in older adults.
- Established Renal Transplant Centre, with a focus to transplant kidney into patients with financial constraint.
- MGM Medical College adopted Municipal Hospital, Khopoli to provide specialised healthcare services to the people of Khopoli.
- Establishing a De-Addiction Centre to provide medical and counselling support to addicts of alcohol, tobacco or banned substances to come out of addiction and lead normal healthy life.
- MGMIHS has joined the Health Consortium operated by IIT Bombay as an institute partner to foster inter-disciplinary health care innovation with its major contribution in human movement science.












# MGMIHS Towards Achieving Its Mission and Vision



# Dr Shibban Kaul Vice Chancellor (Officiating), MGMIHS

- MGM Medical Colleges, at Navi Mumbai and Aurangabad, approved to enrol 150 MBBS students in each college.
- Of the 777 students admitted during the academic year 495 (64%) were females, a humble contribution of MGMIHS to Hon'ble Prime Minister's slogan of "Beti Padao".
- MCh CVTS and DM Cardiology courses recognized by Medical Council of India.
- Six students appeared in superspecialty examinations, i.e. DM and MCh, all passed.
- 126 candidates appeared in MD & MS examination in the regular batch, 104 (83%) passed. In PG Diploma medical courses result was 75%.
- Results in Nursing, Physiotherapy and Allied Health Sciences, both in UG and PG examinations, highly satisfactory.
- 125 research scholars currently registered to pursue PhD degree programme.
- 314 research papers published in indexed peer reviewed scientific journals.
- Five patents on research innovation filed and all published.
- UNESCO Bioethics Chair established at MGMIHS.
- · 698 students conferred degrees.

#### **Convocation Address by Vice Chancellor**

Dr Shibban Kaul welcomed the Chief Guest Shri Kamalkishor Kadam; Chancellor Dr Narayankhedkar; members of the MGM Trust, Board of Management, Academic Council; faculty members, parents of students, students and other invited guests.

At the outset, Dr Kaul expressed indebtedness to Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. Sudhir Kadam, who as a head of the university has been nurturing and leading this great institute most ably and fast-tracking it to achieve its stated mission and vision. Dr Kaul apprised the members that the Vice Chancellor Dr Sudhir Kadam, who has been away and is unable to participate in this important event, has asked me to convey on his behalf heartiest congratulations to all the students who have been conferred degrees and also thank the faculty for their commitment and support in all the academic programmes. Dr Kaul also mentioned that he, on behalf of the Vice Chancellor, would be presenting some of the accomplishments of the University during the last academic year.

Dr Kaul informed the august gathering that as a health sciences university, MGMIHS has been focusing on two major goals. First goal is to make medical education student-centric and the second goal is to make MGM hospitals patient-centric. He further said "Student-centricity has been achieved by making teaching-learning processes student-friendly, competence-based, interactive, participatory, building bonds between students and teachers, helping slow-learners to overcome their difficulties and ensuring that essential practical clinical skills are imparted to every student. Patient centricity means offering best available, evidence-based, comprehensive and affordable care with utmost compassion and empathy, which is aimed not solely at the disease or condition for which the patients come to seek treatment, but also synchs with all their holistic background like financial standing, social status, cultural beliefs, emotional issues and family problems."

We can state with a sense of pride that our university has achieved a lot in both student-centric teaching and patient-centric health-care, and this has resulted in award of Grade 'A' by NAAC in 2014, NABL accreditation for laboratories and RGAY, NABH accreditation with Grade 'A' plus for our hospitals and blood banks. We will not rest on our laurels, we will keep advancing our goal posts farther and farther away.

There have been some very noteworthy developments in research activities during the year. A state-of-the art Human Movement Science Centre was established in Physiotherapy Department at Navi Mumbai in collaboration with Cardiff University, UK, International Society of Biomechanics and IIT Bombay. It was inaugurated by Dr. Anil Kakodkar, Ex-Chairman, Atomic Energy Commission. The Center will conduct research on human movement science. Some of the research projects have already been sponsored by various agencies like National Sciences and Research Council, Canada, Shashtri Indo-Canadian Institute, and

Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. Our compliments to Director Physiotherapy, Dr. Rajani Mullerpatan for these accomplishments.

OMICS Research Centre, headed by Dr. Raman Yadav, had registered three patents last year; one related to generation of cerium nanoparticles with enhanced antioxidant activity; second about biogenic method of generating multiple nanoparticles in a cost-effective way; and third pertains to anti-obesity properties of a herbal lipase inhibitory molecule derived from the plant Mesua ferrea (called Naga-Champa in Hindi). Total number of patents filed by the centre has grown to five.

MGMIHS is developing a chip-based point-of-care test to diagnose pulmonary tuberculosis, in collaboration with Biotechnology Department of BARC and BITS Pilani, Goa Campus. Principal investigators in this projects are Dr. Mansi Rathore and Dr V K Suri. A patent for the sensor has been registered, based on detection of minute amounts of genetic material of actively dividing mycobacteria in blood and other secretions of patients. Preliminary reports are encouraging.

Another spot test for the diagnosis of pulmonary tuberculosis, based on detection of mycobacterial volatile chemical markers in patient's breath, is being developed by the Departments of Respiratory Medicine and Microbiology of MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai, in collaboration with University of Utah, USA. Pro Vice Chancellor (Research) Dr. Chander Puri has been personally involved in this study. Initial results are very encouraging. This test and the sensor-based chip test, which I had mentioned earlier, should help in national tuberculosis eradication program by diagnosing active pulmonary tuberculosis at a nominal cost, even in remote areas.

In addition, 584 research projects are currently ongoing at Navi Mumbai and Aurangabad campuses and another 360 were completed during the last academic year. The projects included thesis and dissertations of PG students and research scholars. In September 2015, MGM Medical College, Aurangabad had entered into collaboration with KYUGPOK National University, South Korea in the field of Medical Education, Research and Faculty Development. Two faculty members from the college Dr. Thamame and Dr. Chawbda had visited the University in June 2015.

A total 314 research papers were published in peer reviewed international and national journals and 9 chapters were contributed to text books by MGMIHS faculty.

I am also happy to inform you that UNESCO Bioethics Chair has been established at MGMIHS. The writ of establishment of the Chair was handed over by Dr. Russell D'souza, Head, Asia Pacific Region, Bioethics UNESCO, Australia. This was followed by a three day workshop in Integrated Bioethics Course. The participants received accreditation as Trainers at the end of the workshop. The establishing of UNESCO Bioethics nodal centre at the university will promote ethical issues in academic programs as well as healthcare services. Study on Bioethics has been incorporated in medical, nursing and physiotherapy curriculam from this academic year in a structured manner. I compliment Dr. Ajit Shroff for taking over the Chair of Bioethics.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is working proactively at the University level as well as at its affiliated institutes and departments. University Cell is chaired by the Pro Vice Chancellor. Every quarter, a centralized report is prepared and discussed during the meeting of the Board of Management. Consolidated Annual IQAC Report is uploaded on the university website and hard copy mailed to UGC.

Let me now apprise you of some additions in our hospitals. Clinical Skill and Simulation Labs were set up at Aurangabad and Navi Mumbai to teach basic life-saving skills and bedside procedures. MGM Hospital, Navi Mumbai was registered for carrying out renal transplants and one successful transplant has already been done. MGM Hospital, Aurangabad is also a registered renal transplant centre, which has recently done the first cadaveric renal transplant successfully. The centre is now gearing up for Liver Transplant. Other notable additions at Aurangabad include establishment of Sleep Apnea Lab, Nephrology-Urology Ward and Obs/Gynac ICU. At Navi Mumbai Hospital, MRI and CT Scan machines were replaced with more advanced features. A new 20 bedded fully equipped Emergency Medical Ward has been established, where critical patients are stabilized before being shifted to respective ICUs. An average of about 50 major Cardiac, Vascular and Thoracic operations are being carried out in both hospitals every month. Both are equipped with world class facilities for cardiac surgery.

Other areas where MGM Hospitals have excelled are interventional endoscopy, laparoscopic surgeries, interventional cardiology, thrombolysis for acute cerebro-vascular strokes, joint replacements and emergency and elective neurosurgery.

In both the MGM hospitals, we follow the dictum that no treatment, how-so-ever expensive, will be denied to any poor patient who cannot afford it. Poor patients not only get free treatment, but also food and hospitalization. Even their attendants, sometimes the entire family is provided free food and stay.

At MGMIHS, we are conscious of the fact that most of us encounter some stress in our daily lives. Besides affecting physical, mental and social health, the stress adversely influences productivity, learning and teaching skills. MGMIHS has introduced some destressing techniques for everyone. We were introduced to Heartfulness Foundation's meditation techniques. We found them quite effective destressing tools. When Lord Budha was asked what did he get by meditation. He replied "Nothing, but I lost anger, anxiety, depression and fear of old age and death". It is our humble suggestion to everyone to practice meditation and start doing it now. You may feel positive change.


Coming back to today's function, degrees and diplomas will be conferred to 698 students in Medical,

#### **Wipe Tears From the Eyes of Every Poor**

I stand here to welcome all dignitaries and honor achievements of young graduates who have achieved their success with hard work, dedication and commitment. While going out of portal of this prestigious Institute forget not the mission of this alma matter; "the mission of Mahatma Gandhi to wipe every tear from every eye of the poor".

I know you are the privileged one now. As a matter of fact, it is also Thanks Giving Day. Thanks to the parents, teachers and colleagues who through their hard work have groomed you as a responsible citizen and a medical doctor of this nation.

All of you were born after 1947, and must be knowing that on the threshold of independence, the average life expectancy of an Indian male was 32 years and an Indian women just 26 years. After a journey of over 65 years, today the life expectancy at birth of an Indian male is 67 years and that a woman 69 years. Please note, an increase from 26 years to 69 years that is what has happened. You can imagine the efforts which must have gone for this great achievement. Availability of clean potable water, sanitation, pollution control, invention of modern medicines, accessibility of healthcare services have contributed to this achievement.

I must say, we are still not satisfied with the development in the rural sector. The development of infrastructure, hospitals and many other facilities and services which are essential for all human beings are still not available to the poor rural sector. Those few who have money and power everything is available, but not to the rural poor, even the medical services are not available to them.

Much still needs to be done. Our country spends just about 1.3% of GDP on health sector which is far less than what even countries like China and Russia spend. In many countries, it is the Government which takes care of entire expenditure on health as well as education of citizens. In my view, Government of India should spend at least 3% of GDP on healthcare sector, as I said earlier the rich can command anything but the question is of the poor.

What are we going to do for the poor, which constitute more than 50% of the entire population. What is our duty for them, what is our responsibility for them, what we have to do for them is our priority.

Dear friends, you are trained here, you can earn in millions, but my request to all of you on this occasion is that while you earn millions but also serve the poor. They are waiting for you. Government of India spends over rupees 25 lacks on a student to become a medical doctor, while you have a responsibility towards the needy, the Government has a right to expect from you.

If government ask you to go to the villages and work there, all of you must spend at least one year. You will also gain experience when you see how the poor live, what is their social status, how you can serve them, you will learn lessons of life, this teaching in four walls will train you in profession. Training outside the four walls of this hospital will make you human being and that's what Mahatma Gandhi expected be a good human being and treat the poor as a human being.

I wish you all success in life, your future journey in the light of Mahatma Gandhi's teaching as I said try to wipe out every tear from every eye of the poor, I wish you best luck.

- MGM Medical College and Hospital, Aurangabad and Kyungpook National University Medical Centre, Republic of Korea signed an MOU to promote collaboration in the fields of education, research and medical training.
- MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy, Navi Mumbai and World Spine Care signed an MOU to offer evidence-based care of global merit to underserved people with spine problems, and to pursue research addressing to the spine care needs of local population.
- MGMIHS, University of Utah, USA and NanoSynth Materials and Sensors Inc. signed an MOU to develop point-of-care test for diagnosis of pulmonary tuberculosis.

#### **Academic Programmes**

- Medical Council of India (MCI) recognised the facilities available at the two MGM Medical Colleges and has enhanced the intake of MBBS students to 150 at each medical college.
- MCI approved starting of new postgraduate courses in Geriatrics, Immuno-haematology and Blood Transfusion, and Emergency Medicine. Students admitted in postgraduate medical courses have more than doubled in ten years.

- Organised conferences, workshops, CMEs and other courses for capacity building, enhancing linkages with other institutions, and wider dissemination of information in various disciplines.

- Publications in peer reviewed indexed scientific journals increased from 122 during 2013, to 244 during 2014, and to 314 during 2015.

- The number of Ph.D. research scholars registered with MGMIHS increased from 61 in 2012 to 152 during 2016. Twenty one Ph.D. scholars have been awarded degrees, including nine at the Sixth Convocation of the University held on 30th August 2016 at Aurangabad.
- MGMIHS started publishing quarterly a peerreviewed scientific journal, MGM Journal of Medical Sciences, indexed in Copernicus with IC value of 83.47 for 2015, Google Scholar, EBSCO, Genamics and many more indexing and abstracting sources of international repute.
- MGMIHS has jointly with MGM Dental College and Hospital started publishing a Journal of Contemporary Dentistry.
- To promote research and dissemination of information related to children MGMIHS, jointly with Pediatrics Association of India, has started publishing quarterly New Indian Journal of Pediatrics.

#### **Clinical Services**

- The number of patients availing OPD services at MGM Medical Colleges and Hospitals, crossed one million during 2015-16, including over hundred thousand super speciality OPDs. Over 82,000 patients were admitted during 2015 for delivery of time-sensitive critical care with serious illnesses, injuries and requiring specialised services
- MGM Hospitals catered healthcare services, including diagnostic and therapeutic, free of cost to patients below poverty line and offered 50% charity to other financially constraint patients.
- Government of Maharashtra has empanelled

MGM Medical College and Hospital to provide cashless services to financially constraint population under Rajeev Gandhi Jeevan Gandhi Arogya Yojna. Thousands of patients have availed specialized services in various departments.

- Created excellent facilities for patient care, including: Immuno-haematology and Blood Transfusion, Renal Transplant, Prosthetics and Orthotics, Joint Replacement, Neuro- and Spine Surgeries.
- Critical care services expanded in medicine, paediatric, surgery, CVTS, neurology and EMS.
- Geriatric medical speciality started, to prevent and treat diseases and disabilities in older adults.
- MGM Medical College adopted Municipal Hospital, Khopoli to provide specialised healthcare services to the people of Khopoli.
- Establishing a De-Addiction Centre to provide medical and counselling support to addicts of alcohol, tobacco or banned substances to come out of addiction and lead normal healthy life.

#### **Community Outreach Programmes**

- MGMIHS and its constituent Colleges and University Departments adopted villages; Ambelohal, Nanded, Tara, Ellora, Vardukazi; for overall development.
- Provided services to the people from neighboring villages of Raigad district through health education, and health screening.
- Fairs, festivals, conferences and seminars organized to find program gaps; generate evidence; translate behavioral, social science and medical research findings into programs.
   Such initiatives have made significant impact on local, underserved communities.
- Developed collaboration with UNFPA, IPAS, Rasayani, Shantivan, Sharan to maximise the outcome of outreach programmes
- MGMIHS has joined the Health Consortium operated by IIT Bombay as an institute partner to foster inter-disciplinary health care innovation with its major contribution in human movement science.

#### **MGMIHS: Mission Statement**

For the MGMIHS, the mission is guided by: **Excellence** in research, education and clinical work; Collaboration with the medical district and other research institutions worldwide; **Diversity** in all its forms from students, faculty, areas of research to collaborative partners- as a means to a higher quality of health care for all; Innovation and translation of new knowledge and new approaches to disease and health care delivery; Integrity and Commitment to the people we work with as patients, research subjects, and students, faculty and staff; and **Hope** for our patients and supporters by striving toward cures, diagnosis and prevention for diseases that have plagued humankind for millennia.

### RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

Research continued to provide thrust to all academic, healthcare and administrative programs during the academic year. Research programs were provided further impetus by expanding the central research facilities; enhanced core support from the MGM Institute of Health Sciences (MGMIHS); admitting Ph.D. research scholars; enhanced funding from extra-mural sources; networking with national and international agencies; instituting The **United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization** (UNESCO) Chair in bioethics; capacity building through workshops, training courses, national and international conferences; and many more. Publication of over 320 research papers in national and international journals during the academic year is a testimony to the enhanced research investment, appreciation of committing to research, research output and performance. The publication covered basic, applied, experimental, clinical trials and strategic research.

#### **Research Monitoring Committees**

To help steer the research programs, MGMIHS had constituted three committees namely: Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC); Ethics Committee for Research on Human Subjects (ECRHS), which is registered with Drug Controller General of India; and Committee to Develop and Validate Research Tools, including Questionnaire for Medical and Health Research.

Thirteen meetings of the SAC were held during the academic year. The committee has highly eminent members representing various institutes and colleges of MGMIHS, and some from other institutes of repute. The broad mandate of SAC is to: review the progress in clinical and biomedical research being pursued by the faculty at University, highlight the strengths and weaknesses of ongoing research programs and initiatives; help the faculty in identifying key emerging and future areas of life sciences research of national relevance, and help in conceptualizing and formulating new research projects; help in research capacity building of the scientists; recommend allocation of funds from the University to support high priority, nationally relevant projects; and help the faculty generate extramural funding from national and international agencies.

Three meetings of Ethics Committee were held and only those projects which were approved by the Ethics Committee were pursued.

Since a number of research projects pursued by Ph.D. research scholars required data collection through well structured questionnaire, a Committee to Develop and Validate Research Tools was constituted to review and approve the format and questionnaire. The Committee met 4 times during the year and approved the data collection tools of 17 projects. This process had ensured that the tools to be used for data collection are validated by experts in the field and the research output valid and acceptable. In fact, it had enhanced the quality of research

considerably apart from capacity building of Ph.D. scholars in developing questionnaires to be used for research purposes.

#### PhD Research Scholars

MGM Institute of Health Sciences has since 2009 enrolled 156 Ph.D. scholars in various disciplines and subjects, of which 85 (55%) been female. Twenty-one students, including nine during this academic year, have so far been awarded PhD degrees. Fourteen new students had registered during 2015-16. Nine students were conferred Ph.D. degree at the Sixth Convocation of MGMIHS held in August 2016.



Figure: PhD Scholars awarded degrees during Sixth Convocation of MGMIHS in 2016.




Figure: The number of publications in indexed peer-reviewed scientific journals increased appreciably during 2015-16 as compared to the previous years.

#### MGM Journal of Medical Sciences

The University had started publishing a journal "MGM Journal of Medical Sciences" in 2014. This quarterly peer-reviewed scientific journal was indexed in Indexed Copernicus with IC Value of 83.47 for 2015. The journal is indexed in Google Scholar, EBSCO, Genamics Journal Seek, WHOIMSEAR and many more indexing and abstracting sources of international repute. It is a reflection of the high quality of research and review articles published in the journal apart from its multidisciplinary coverage.

#### **Capacity Building**

Two Ph.D. students; Dr Pravin Rathod and Dr Monali Sonawane, had joined the 7-months distance learning online training course in research methodology in the area of sexual and reproductive health conducted by Geneva Foundation for Medical Education and Research. They had completed the course with distinction. In addition, a number of Ph.D. students were sponsored to participate in the Scientific Writing Workshop, organised by the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, and one-month Department of Health Research Training Course, organised to enhance skills of scholars and young faculty in molecular biology techniques.

#### Conferences/Workshops

MGM Institute of Health Sciences has accorded high priority to support research to curtail the disease burden because of tuberculosis (TB). The priority is to develop more affordable, sensitive and specific methods for diagnosis of tuberculosis. Clinical study evaluating a breath-based point-of-care test for diagnosis of pulmonary TB, and another evaluating a laser-based fluorescent TB detection system are being actively pursued. To provide thrust to research in this area as well as to sensitise the healthcare providers about the need to promote research in the area of TB diagnosis, two meetings were held. The first was a Brainstorming Session on "Strategies to Stop TB" held on 6<sup>th</sup> February 2016. The second Symposium was held on "Breakthroughs and New Challenges in the Diagnosis and Management of Tuberculosis" from 18-19 March 2016. Faculty from leading institutions in the country, from international agencies such as; World Health Organization (WHO), FIND and many more had participated in the two events.

#### Research Collaboration and Networking

The University had signed the following Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for promoting collaboration of MGMIHS and its constituent colleges and Departments with other national and international agencies:

 MGMIHS and IKP Knowledge Park signed an MOU to develop point-ofcare test for diagnosis of pulmonary tuberculosis.

- MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy established a Centre for Human Movement Science with support from International Society for Biomechanics and Bioengineering; and Technology Incubation Centre, IIT, Mumbai.
- MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy; Department of Mechanical and Materials Engineering, Queen's University, Canada; and Shreemati Nathibai Damodar Thackersey (SNDT) Women's University, Mumbai, India engaged in inter-disciplinary project on pelvimetry to gain an insight in birthing positions which can be used, an initiative sponsored by Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council, and Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute.
- MGM Medical College and Hospital, Aurangabad and Kyungpook National University Medical Centre, Republic of Korea signed an MOU to promote collaboration in the fields of education, research and medical training.
- MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy, Navi Mumbai and World Spine Care signed an MOU to offer evidence-based care of global merit to underserved people with spine problems, and to pursue research addressing to the spine care needs of local population.
- MGMIHS, University of Utah, USA and NanoSynth Materials and Sensors Inc. signed an MOU to develop point-of-care test for diagnosis of pulmonary tuberculosis.
- Established UNESCO Chair in Bioethics Haifa with a primary aim to define and promote ethical practices in all academic activities, including teaching, evaluation, monitoring, research and clinical care.

#### Highlights of Some Research Programs

OMICS Research Center of MGMIHS is an innovative centre actively engaged in research and training. Center is accelerating the basic and applied research in the area of molecular diagnostics, drug discovery and green technology. Using various domains of OMICS such as; genomics, proteomics and computational biology, the Center is providing unique and exploratory platform for discovery research. Researchers at MGMIHS are mainly working in the area of biomarker discovery, drug discovery, reversal of drug resistance and nano-biotechnology.

In 2015-16 major focus of the research was on biogenic synthesis of nanoparticles including florescent nanoparticles and plant derived pancreatic lipase inhibitor as potential anti-obesity principle. To boost our drug discovery program, Center has initiated in the area of multifunctional anti-diabesity molecule and looking for a

molecule for reversal of drug resistance in malaria.

Towards biological synthesis of nanoparticles centre has successfully established several major biological systems for the synthesis of bioactive nanoparticles such as; silver, cerium, zinc, silicon, calcium, magnesium and iron. Work is demonstrated in the area of green synthesis of nanoparticles with florescence property. Generation of multifunctional nanoparticles is a major achievement of the Center and has recently filed a patent application in this area. The Center has developed a unique single biogenic process that can be used for the synthesis of different types of bioactive nanoparticles such as; Ce, Ag, Zn, Fe, Mg, Ca, and Si. This type of process will not only add a new innovation in nano-biotechnology but will give a new direction in cost-effective green process for biofabrication of nanomaterials for various medical applications.

Centre has been continuously working and advancing in the area of natural pancreatic lipase inhibitor. Discovering the new source of plant derived pancreatic lipase inhibitor from food plant is a major accomplishment.

The Department of Medical Biotechnology has developed and patented a laser-based fluorescent detection system for diagnosis of tuberculosis. Validation of the method in a clinical setting is in progress. In addition, the research is focussed on identifying causes of drug-induced kidney failure. The studies have shown that it was possible to identify active site pockets in the related proteins and the interacting amino acids residues of cytochrome P450 that may contribute to drug-induced kidney failure. The investigators have developed use of Zebrafish as an animal model to assess the biological and toxicological effects of new drugs and alternative medicines like, homeopathy. One extramural project was funded by Board of Research in Nuclear Science, to explore hypothesis of nanoparticles existence in homeopathy drugs and its mechanism was studied using Zebra fish as a vertebrate model.

Other interesting area is establishment of Hydroponic Lab. Hydroponic systems have been utilized as one of the standard methods for plant biology research and also used in commercial production for several crops, including lettuce, vegetables. In MGMIHS, Biotechnology Department had developed a raft based hydroponic protocol that can be easily implemented in laboratories interested in pursuing studies on plant mineral nutrition.

**Department of Pharmacology** has successfully developed a unique experimental model of diabetes co-existing with metabolic syndrome useful for screening of pharmacological agents such as DPP-IV inhibitors, beneficial in this disease condition. Berberine and mangiferin, the active ingredients of medicinal plants possessed significant DPP-IV inhibitory activity as delineated using *in vitro*, *in vivo* and *in silico* docking studies against crystal structure of DPP-IV. The DPP-IV

inhibitory activity of berberine and mangiferin was found to be comparable to synthetic marketed DPP-IV inhibitors; vildagliptin and sitagliptin. Like vildagliptin, berberine and mangiferin bind within the active site pocket (the 1st largest pocket) of DPP-IV enzyme whereas, sitagliptin prefers to bind in the second largest pocket of DPP-IV enzyme. The natural DPP-IV inhibitors: berberine and mangiferin were efficacious in attenuating the deleterious effects of diabetes, co-existing with metabolic syndrome. Besides DPP-IV inhibition, there are several other mechanisms (reduction in insulin resistance, preservation of beta cell mass as well as function, anti-apoptotic, hypolipidemic, anti-inflammatory, antioxidant, and hypotensive activities) contributing to the beneficial effects of berberine and mangiferin. There exists preliminary experimental evidence on the possible place for natural DPP-IV inhibitors in antidiabetic therapy. Interestingly, combination therapy of both berberine and mangiferin with metformin was found to be superior as compared to meformin monotherapy. The highlight of the study is that the cardiometabolic efficacy of mangiferin and metformin combination therapy was found to be comparable to vildagliptin and metformin combination therapy. While no single antidiabetic agent ideal for metabolic syndrome as a whole exists as yet, natural DPP-IV inhibitors such as berberine and mangiferin offer potential as an adjuvant therapy with metformin, having beneficial effects on individual components of metabolic syndrome.

MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy, Navi Mumbai: continued to strive to build its research capacity at national and international levels. The momentous occasion was inauguration of MGM Centre of Human Movement Science by Dr. Anil Kakodkar and Shri Kamal Kishorji Kadam supported by International Society of Biomechanics and Bioengineering and Technology Centre, IIT Bombay. The centre is gaining national repute for its advanced research facility, exclusive clinical facility for movement analysis and training in clinical biomechanics. In the first year itself 2 interdisciplinary collaborative research projects attracted extramural funding. One project was funded by Indo-Canadian Shastri Foundation and National Science and Engineering Research Board, Canada to explore pelvimetry and gain further insight to improve the birth experience with Queen's University Canada and SNDT Women's University, Mumbai. Second project was funded by Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India to design a new trans-tibial prosthesis with Department of Mechanical Engineering, Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay and MGM Institute's University Department of Prosthetics and Orthotics, Navi Mumbai.

MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy, Navi Mumbai initiated MOU between MGMIHS & Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay to enable participation of University as a clinical and research partner of a wider

network of Healthcare Consortium. Nodal officers for MGMIHS are Lt Gen. Dr. S.K. Kaul & Dr. Rajani Mullerpatan.

The Department actively participated in the Annual Steering Committee of Biomedical Engineering and Technology (Incubation) Center (BETiC) chaired by Dr. Anil Kakodkar in the planning of medical device innovations to meet unmet clinical needs. As an attempt to initiate industry interaction in application of movement science, the Department had an opportunity to interact with visionary philanthropist Shri Ratan Tata and presented the scope of MGM Centre of Human Movement Science (MGMCHMS).

Graduate and postgraduate students continued to pursue research topics in tune with the thrust research areas of the Department and presented and published at scientific conferences.

MGM Institute's University Department of Nursing, and MGM College of Nursing, Navi Mumbai are very vibrant departments with more than 16 students registered for Ph.D. degree program. The focus of one of the research project has been to study the perceptions of nursing students on clinical teaching behavior of teaching faculty. The study has shown an association between actual clinical teaching behaviors practiced by teaching faculty and learning of students. The nursing teacher's role necessitates the maintenance of an environment of mutual trust and respect to support student learning and growth.

In another study, the nursing faculty had derived information about awareness on breast cancer among women. The study was conducted keeping in view the magnitude, mortality and lack of knowledge of women regarding breast cancer with the objective to assess the knowledge and practice of breast self-examination among working women. The study suggests the need for enhancing awareness about breast cancer. The hospitals should adopt new policies for prevention and screening of breast cancer.

The major focus of research of MGM College of Nursing has been to purse research to bring down mortality and morbidity among women and children. In addition, research projects are aimed at prevention and management of diabetes mellitus, cardiovascular diseases and stroke. Projects related to malnutrition in children, and cervical cancer among women was also addressed. Two PhD scholars working on these aspects were awarded degree during the year and another two had submitted their PhD thesis.

#### MGM Central Medical Library

The Library of MGM Medical College came into existence 27 years ago when the Medical College was just established. It was accommodated, originally, in a small room located on the first floor of the Preventive and Social Medicine Block. It was shifted to a separate specified area in 2003 in the same floor with a carpet area of 10700 sq. feet. It moved again from 1<sup>st</sup> floor to 2<sup>nd</sup> floor in November 2008 to a larger space with a plinth area of 25000 sq. feet in order to accommodate its ever growing collection. Its physical infrastructure has further been strengthened and developed in order to cope with the status of Central Medial Library of MGM Institute of Health Sciences in accordance to the position of Deemed University which was accorded in 2006 by the University Grants Commission, Government of India.

The library endeavours to offer health literature, library and information services extensively and exhaustively to a wide spectrum of users comprising of students, teachers, research scholars, paramedical and auxiliary health personnel involved in education, academics, patient care and research in various branches of health and allied sciences. The library collects a wide range of information and reference material in all major areas of health sciences for the advancement of education and research. It makes efforts to disseminate evidence-based information on demand as well as in anticipation to medical scientists with a view to help them in acquiring well-equipped clinical skills and attitudes necessary for providing the best patient care.

#### Opening hours of the library

The Library remains open from 0800 to 2200 hrs Monday to Saturday. Issue timings on week days are 0830 to 1900 hrs. Photocopying service is available from 1000 to 1800 hrs throughout the week. On Sundays and holidays, only reading room facilities are provided to Library users from 1000 to 1800 hrs. The Library remains closed on national and a few local holidays.

#### Acquisition of Books and Subscription to Journals

At the end of 30 June 2016, the collection of Library was 48,564 (Aurangabad: 16,675 and Navi Mumbai: 31,889) documents which included textbooks: 27660; and reference books: 9353. During the period under review, 1416 (textbooks: 1036; and reference books: 380) copies of books were acquired in diverse fields of health and allied sciences. Newly acquired copies were classified according to the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) Scheme, 22<sup>nd</sup> edition. US-NLM Medical Subject Headings (MESH) was used for assigning the subjects. For cataloguing the documents, the Anglo-American Cataloguing Rules I, II were used. The books and monographs were arranged in classified order in three places according to their usage, viz. (i) Books Stacks; (ii) Reference Section; and (iii) Recent Arrivals. In fact, this arrangement had facilitated in quick and pin-pointed retrieval of needed documents from the shelves. Call Numbers emanating from DDC and their transliteration languages were used and pasted them on each Book Stacks as bay guides.

A total of 314 (International: 147, National: 167) scholarly core medical periodical titles were subscribed. The latest copies of issues of journals as and when received were displayed in alphabetical order in Display Racks with a view to provide maximum visibility to users. And 177 online journals (International: 35; National: 142) were subscribed. Old issues of journals were kept behind the each latest displayed issue in respective cabinet in a systematic order. 14360 (Aurangabad: 4825 and Navi Mumbai: 9535) back volumes of journals duly bound were organized in alphabetical order behind the display racks and corridor. 685 (Aurangabad: 316 and Navi Mumbai: 369) volumes of International/National journals were received complete in all respect. 316 volumes were got bound. Journal Section has capacity to accommodate 52 users at a time where they can sit and consult their needed literature.

#### **E-Library**

The Library is a well-equipped Virtual Learning Centre (E-Library), with excellent state-of-art computer facilities including over 50 internet connected computer terminals, each provided with e-mail facility and access to e-materials and e-resources. Besides internet/online facilities, the desk to access in various departments and multiuser access with regard to Library Management Software at E-Library has been set up. The Library's online public access catalogue helps the readers in searching the documents of their choice and their availability in central and departmental libraries within the campus. Hyper links for 3823 e-journals, 411

e-books, and 28 e-databases were provided for accessing the e-health literature/information, free of cost. About 9,598 e-journals were accessible at MGMMC, Aurangabad through MEDLINE database.

#### **Automation of Library Collection**

KOHA - Open source library automation software designed to manage physical collections of items (books, CD's, videos, reference, etc.) was installed as a replacement of LibSys. In this Software, user interface is configurable and adaptable. It provides cataloguing, Searching, Member/patron management, an acquisitions system, and circulation (issues, returns, and reserves). The salient features of KOHA are: (i) A full featured modern integrated library software (ILS); (ii) Award winning, Free/Open-source Software. (No license fee); (iii) OS independent any operating system. Linux, UNIX, Mac; (iv) Web based. Webbased Interfaces and can integrate with website; (v) Full MARC21 and UNIMARC support for professional cataloguing; (vi) Multilingual and multi-user support; (vii) Library Standards-Compliant. Industrial standards & protocols; (viii) Z39.50 server; (ix) Customizable web based OPAC, circulation system; (x) Online reservation; (xi) Full catalogue, circulation, acquisition, & library stock management; (xii) Web based OPAC; (xiii) Major industry-standard database type (text, RDBMS), MYSQL; (xiv) Print barcode; (xv) KOHA support SIP2 protocol to provide unlimited connection for work with RFID; and ((xvi) Export and import records.

Till date, bibliographical descriptions of 18058 documents of MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai has been put. Bibliographical data of 6163 documents with regard to various campus libraries attached to - (a) MGM Institute's University Department of Physiotherapy (565 books); (b) MGM College of Physiotherapy (3109 books), (c) MGM Institute's Department of Bio-Medical Sciences (453 books); and (d) MGM Institute of Health Sciences (2036 books) are under process. Detailed information in respect of different categories of library users like; undergraduates, postgraduates, faculty staff, paramedical and allied health personnel etc. have been recorded appropriately.

#### Website of MGM Central Medical Library

An exclusive website for the Library was launched in 2014. The site was hyperlinked to a wide range of information resources, services and policies. It provided information on organization of Library collection, acquisition policy, Library committee and eligibility to use the Library facilities and so on. More than 234 copies of theses, 560 core medical books, and 323 (Aurangabad: 113 and Navi

Mumbai:210) peer-reviewed papers were published. In addition, web links to a number of e-resources and prominent health science institutions/universities in the country and their libraries were added. All issues of MGM Journal of Medical Sciences (MGMJMS), MGM News, and Annual Report of MGMIHS for 2014-15 published so far were linked with website in order to make them electronically accessible throughout the world. The website is updated regularly.

#### **Lending services**

Books are issued to all students, faculty, researchers, health administrators, paramedical and allied health personnel and staff. Student can keep the books for 7days. However, if they need for longer period, the concern book can be reissued. During the period under review, 62284 copies of books were issued to postgraduates (1335), undergraduates (34589), faculty staff (2288), researchers (912), paramedical students - physiotherapy, B.Sc. & M.Sc., biomedical - (22028) and allied health personnel (1132).

#### Utilization of library facilities

The Library was visited by 67671 users comprising of postgraduates (1517), undergraduates (36949), faculty (3201), researchers (1036), paramedical students physiotherapy, B.Sc. & M.Sc., biomedical – (23693) and allied health personnel (1275). The statistics revealed that the Library facilities were used extensively by the biomedical community.

#### Current awareness service

Under *current-awareness service* (*CAS*), the Library launched the compilation of fortnightly issue of "*Library News*" in January 2015. So far, 24 issues containing 2286 copies of contents pages of articles/papers published in recent health science journals received in the Library were circulated among the medical scientists in order to keep them abreast with the latest development taken in their respective fields of health sciences. The photocopies of article(s) were provided on request.

The "List of Additions" a monthly publication, which contains the bibliographical descriptions on new books added to the Library, was launched under CAS Service Program in January 2015. The electronic copies were circulated among medical scientists through e-mail in order to abreast them about new books added to the Library. So far, 24 issues containing detailed bibliographical descriptions on 995 new books added to the Library were compiled and circulated.

#### Reference and referral services

Reference service was provided for queries from the available sources. A total of 1180 references were provided. Besides, 1150 users were apprised about the resources available in libraries of other institutes under referral service. And 1825 queries were answered on phone. Newspapers clippings of more than 300 items were circulated from time to time among concerned officials of MGMIHS. Also through E-Mail, it provided relevant health literature/information available on Internet to its users.

#### **Document Delivery Service**

Photocopies of 363 articles containing more than 2500 pages were provided. The photocopies of requested articles were supplied from in-house sources as well as from the resources of other libraries under resource sharing mechanism.

#### MGM Publication

The University has launched in 2014, a quarterly peer-reviewed scientific journal "MGM Journal of Medical Sciences (MGMJMS)" to encourage investigators to publish their research findings for wider dissemination with the aim of applying those for the benefit of the society. Within a span of less than 3 years, it has been indexed in *Index Copernicus* with *IC value of 83.47 for 2015*. The journal is also indexed in Google Scholar, EBSCO, Genamics JournalSeek, WHOIMSEAR and many more indexing and abstracting sources of international repute.

During the period under review, *MGMJMS* volume 2 issue no. 3, July – September 2015, issue no. 4, October-December 2015; and volume 3, issue no. 1, January-March 2016, and issue no. 2, April-June 2016 were released. The copies of print version of the journal were circulated extensively among the medical scientists, health sciences Institutions/ Colleges/Universities. #### FROM DIRECTOR'S DESK



This annual report outlines the activities of University Department of Biomedical Sciences over the year 2015-16. It is responsibility of government to provide health care; we as a university department play a vital role to support government in their effort toward achieving the targets.

#### Allied Health Professional

Allied health professional includes individuals involved with the delivery of health or related services, with expertise contributing in therapeutic, diagnostic, curative, preventive & rehabilitative interventions. They work in inter disciplinary health teams including physicians, Nurses and public health officials to promote, to protect, treat and manage a person physical, mental, social, emotional, environmental health and holistic well-being.

#### Scope and need

In the healthcare system, with advancements in technology over the past few decades, the quality of medical care has vastly improved across the world. This has thrown up fresh challenges for the healthcare field. There is now more recognition of the fact, that health service delivery is no longer just a prerogative of physicians and nurses, it is now a tea effort, drawing upon the expertise of both clinicians and non-clinicians. Today, there is an urgent need for competence. In fact, diagnosis as one of the thematic group has become so dependent on technology that the role of allied health professionals has become vital in delivering successful treatment.

Effective delivery of healthcare services depends largely on the nature of education, training and appropriate orientation towards community health of all categories of health personnel, and their capacity to function as an integrated team. AHPs with a range of skills and expertise; plays key roles within the National Health Service, working autonomously, in multi-professional teams in various settings.

While Indian government aims for the universal health coverage, the lack of skilled human resources may prove to be the biggest impediment in the pathways for achieving the targeted goals for UHC. The need of skilled allied health professionals in the system, such as the case of stroke survivors, it is the support of AHPs that significantly enhance their rehabilitation and long term return to normal life. AHPs play a significant part of their care and return to well-being.

The breadth and scope of the allied health practice varies from one end to another, to enumerate the same the allied health professional may work, towards health promotion and disease prevention as well as assessment, management and evaluation of interventions and protocols for treatment.

Learning goals and objectives for allied health professional are divided into clinical care, communication, membership of multidisciplinary health team, Ethics and accountability at clinical, professional, social and personal levels, commitment to professional excellence, leadership and mentorship, social accountability and responsibility, scientific attitude and lifelong learning.

University Department of Biomedical Science has been established in the year 2007 as a constituent unit of institution. Realizing the importance of the need to expose young minds towards the different disciplines of Allied Sciences, Biomedical courses at an early age and opening up career options other than engineering and medicine.

#### Academics

The department offers 7 undergraduate, 8 post graduate and 11 PhD programs in different disciplines. These programs aim at generating skilled manpower in different areas of biomedical sciences which would not only feed the health services but also would provide trained and a motivated young task force required by other institutions like hospitals, pharmaceutical industries, diagnostic laboratories to name a few, Research, medical, dental, nursing & pharmaceutical education & researcher for national and international institutes.


# HIGHLIGHTS OF TRAINING AT MGM INSTITUTE'S

#### 3.2: Value Added Courses - Clinical Biomechanics

MGM Centre of Human Movement Science conducted two 3- day workshops in Clinical Biomechanics on 26<sup>th</sup>, 27th and 28<sup>th</sup> February 2016 and 1-2-3 April 2016.

- First basic two and half day training course training course in clinical biomechanics was conducted from 26-28th Feb 2016. 49 enthusiastic clinicians coming from various cities of Maharashtra, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala & Delhi benefited from this course. The course was designed with fundamental concepts of motion and force analysis and their applications in various clinical conditions ranging from the most primitive methods to the advanced tools available for movement analysis. Experts in clinical biomechanics and rehabilitation engineering from MGM CHMS & IIT-B delivered the course material. Participants reported an excellent educational value for money (course fee)!
- Within a period of a month MGM CHMS offered second 3 day course in clinical biomechanics from 1-3 April 2016 which was designed for both clinicians and engineers to enhance inter disciplinary interaction and learning. Eleven clinicians of 1st course were motivated to attend the advanced course along with 4 engineers and 15 other clinicians across Maharashtra and Gujarat (total 30 participants). In addition to summarized information on fundamental principles of motion analysis, course delivered knowledge and skill training in exploring applications of musculo-skeletal modelling principles, finite element analysis and OPENSIM software for movement analysis. Experts included human movement scientists from Cardiff University UK & Queen's University Canada in addition to experts from MGM CHMS & IIT-B.






